THE S.P.E.A.R. SYSTEM™

Sgt. Todd Brinkerhoff, Monroe Co. Sheriff's Office - SWAT

Sgt. Anthony Ognissanti, Monroe Co. Sheriff's Office, Public Safety Training Center

A presentation of the "Spontaneous Protection Enabling Accelerated Response" System. This is a behaviorally researched, close quarter personal defense method that utilizes the body's natural flinches and reactions to fear or violence and then converts these reactions into efficient tactical choices. This will be a demonstration and discussion of S.P.E.A.R. and other new techniques that will better prepare officers in the field.

LOCAL TERRORISM TRENDS

Joe Testani, FBI, Coordinator - Rochester Joint Terrorism Task Force

An overall perspective of terrorism and its impact in our local communities. The session will also examine the role New York Probation agencies can play in assisting the FBI and Homeland Security.

THE IMPACT OF ADOLESCENT MALTREATMENT ON LATER CRIME/VIOLENCE

Dr. Tim Ireland, Niagara University, Department of Criminal Justice

Dr. Ireland will address the issue of the consequences of adolescent maltreatment using data from the Rochester Youth Development Study (RYDS). The RYDS is an ongoing study of a representative community sample of adolescents drawn from the Rochester Public Schools. Late adolescent and early adult involvement in delinquency/crime and violence, and arrest histories are considered as outcomes to show that maltreatment occurring during adolescent is developmentally disruptive and requires greater attention from those who work with at-risk populations.

TAKING DOWN "MURDER UNIT"

Sean Martinek and John Brennan were core members of an elite multi-agency law enforcement team that dismantled "Murder Unit," one of Rochester's most notorious street gangs. They will discuss the intelligence gathering, methodology and the execution of the take down and how a variety of agencies assisted them throughout the process.

CLANDESTINE DRUG LABS

Scott Adams, Clandestine Laboratory Coordinator, Drug Enforcement Administration

This program is designed to provide training on identifying clandestine methamphetamine labs, the dangers they pose to our communities and the most effective response when a lab is discovered by a private citizen or member of law enforcement.
